## Crown reveals suspected smuggler is a Tanzanian refugee already ordered out of Canada

The suspect in a massive heroin smuggling case is a Tanzanian refugee who has already been ordered deported from Canada, a prosecutor said Monday.

But Crown lawyer Gregory Harlow said explanation expulsion from Canada is currently under a stay order because of his refugee status.

Harlow said a Jan. 9, 2007 deportation order was later stayed until Dec. 17, 2017 because "claimed protected person status under refugee law."

Harlow wants provincial court Judge Gary Cioni to detain pending trial, noting the Ontario man is facing a lengthy prison term if convicted.

He was arrested April 24, at Calgary International Airport after arriving on a flight from Amsterdam which originated in Johannesburg, South Africa.

Harlow said Canadian Border Services Agency official found nearly 12 kg of heroin inside a secret luggage compartment.

The haul, said to be the biggest in Alberta history is "worth approximately \$1.68 million to \$3 million, depending on how it's sold," Harlow said.

He said case-law suggests are is looking at a prison term of between 12 and 17 years in prison if convicted.

"The Crown has a very strong case," he said.

But defence counsel Kaysi Fagan said **1999**, 37, can be released on strict conditions, including that he live with family here in Calgary instead of returning to his Toronto home.

Cioni will hand down a ruling on the bail application on Tuesday.
